
The History of HarperCollins Publishers in Lower Manhattan








CANAL ST. ELEVATION (PARTIAL)





Crash History at Chambers & West Sts

- There were 17 crashes involving serious injuries in last 5 years
- Four of those crashes involved southbound rightturn vehicle making hitting pedestrian or cyclist in west crosswalk/bike path
- Fatal crash in June 2016 where southbound rightturning vehicle hit cyclist in bike path
- NYCDOT proposes marking and signal timing changes to be implemented later this year






Signal Timing


EXISTING SIGNAL TIMING Weekday AM / Weekday PM / AOT










PROPOSED SIGNAL TIMING Weekday AM / Weekday PM / AOT



POST FOCUS ON COMMERCIAL REAL ESTATE

GroupMexpands at 3 WTG



HE New Year got off to a soaring start for Larry Silverstein at 3 World Trade Center.

With the clock ticking down on the end of 2015, WPP-owned media agency giant GroupM completed a lease for a 170,000-square-foot expansion at the fast-rising tower, insiders said.

It's the largest new office commitment at any World Trade Center building since GroupM's original 520,000square-foot lease in December 2013.

Although sources confirmed the lease was signed by both sides, neither side would share other details except that Silverstein of-

fered GroupM considerable future expansion options.

As we reported, GroupM will take floors 32 to 35 in addition to its previously committed blocks on floors 11 to 16 and 28 to 31. The deal makes 3 World Trade's 2.5 million square feet of office space only 28 percent spoken for, but it's not a bad start for a fully speculative project that won't be finished until 2018.

Silverstein was repped inhouse by Jeremy Moss and a CBRE team including Stephen B. Siegel, Mary Ann Tighe and Adam Foster. The tenant was repped by a CBRE team including Tighe and Gregory Tosko.

The GroupM expansion

reflects a pattern of slow but steady lease-up at the site. In September, Moody's took 75,000 square feet at the Port Authority and **Douglas Durst**'s 1 World Trade Center.

Meanwhile, the WTC Transportation Hub Oculus, underground pedestrian corridors and stores and restaurants controlled by retail leaseholder Westfield inch ever closer to opening — including Eataly, which might finally be ready this spring.

In a total surprise, **Dennis Friedrich** has resigned from his position as CEO of Brookfield Property Partners Global Office Division.

Realty Check has learned.

Friedrich, 50, who will step down on Jan. 15, is said to have broken the news to colleagues just before the holidays. There was no word on a successor. Brookfield's rep and Friedrich both declined to comment, but a source said, "It was amicable. He has a strong relationship with Global Office Division Chairman **Ric Clark**. There were no skeletons."

Friedrich seemed as cheerful as ever at the Fried, Frank holiday party in early December. But sources suggested the growing complexity of Brookfield's corporate structure made for an "overcrowded environment," and Friedrich felt it
