- HHS Accelerator Decommissioning: MOCS will be decommissioning HHS Accelerator. HHS Accelerator functionality will be moved into PASSPort to avoid disruption of service and loss of data.
- NEW Document Vault: The PASSPort Vault will allow providers to upload required documents and specify which agencies can view the documents,
- NEW Subcontracting Module: The new module will streamline the subcontractor approval and payment submission processes.



Truly a group effort, the report will be published both in digital and physical copies this year. Check out the finished product here!




EO 34 Improves M/WBE Programs

The new Executive Order 34 will create a more equitable environment for M/WBEs. Under EO 34, Mayoral agencies will:

- Re-evaluate M/WBE goals before renewing a contract;
- De-bundle capital project contracts over \$25 million;
- Consider at least one quote from an M/WBE vendor on all emergency procurements; and
- Standardize M/WBE performance data.

CORE Method: Organize

Organization is an important part of preparing for contracting opportunities.

When you are organized, you can move quickly to respond to contracting opportunities when you find them.

Keep track of contracting events such as procurement fairs and networking events. Of course, you also need to document the contact information for relevant and important people such as Agency contacts, organizations that may partner with you, insurance agents, supplier representatives, etc. Additionally, you should have updated electronic copies of your capability statements, organizational charts, and other standard paperwork. As the saying goes, "stay ready so that you don't have to get ready.

On Monday, October 2nd, the City hosted its annual procurement fair at Barclays Center in Downtown Brooklyn.

MOCS staff was on hand helping prospective contractors navigate the city's procurement system, showcasing our interactive Contracting Roadmap (see below).

The MOCS Learning & Development team also presented: "Strengthening Your CORE: How M/WBEs Can Contract with the City" to 80 attendees, sharing our CORE methodology (communicate, organize, research, executed) and best contracting practices.

The City's M/WBE
Program has increased
significantly since it began.
In 2022, the City awarded
its highest total yet to
M/WBEs of nearly \$1.4
billion! And since the start
of the OneNYC M/WBE
Program in 2015, the City
has awarded City-certified
M/WBEs roughly \$27.9
billion in contracts.

A business seeking M/WBE certification must:

- Be authorized to do business in New York.
- 2. Be in operation for at least one year.
- 3. Be at least 51% woman or minority owned.
