The hearing being conducted today has been 12 publicly advertised in accordance with the New York City Charter and Concession Rules of the City of New 13 14 York. We want to be sure that anyone desiring to be 15 heard has an opportunity to do so. 16 All persons wishing to speak must fill 17 out a request slip, which may be obtained from the 18 Those registered will be called upon to Clerk. testify after their calendar item has been called. 19 20 You may also submit written testimony to the clerk 21 which will be made part of the record. Any written submissions must be given to the clerk before the 2.2 23 close of the public hearing. 24 Will the Clerk please call the first 25 calendar item?

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1	THE CLERK: New York City Department of
2	Parks and Recreation, Calendar Item No. 1: In the
3	matter of the intent to seek Franchise and Concession
4	Review Committee approval pursuant to Section 1-14 of
5	the Concession Rules of the City of New York, to
6	utilize a negotiated concession, to enter into a
7	license agreement with Legends Boathouse, LLC. to
8	provide for the operation, renovation and maintenance
9	of a restaurant, snack bar and rowboat rentals at the
10	Loeb Boathouse in Central Park in the borough of
11	Manhattan. The license will provide for (1) ten-year
12	term, commencing upon written Notice to Proceed.
13	MS. STODDART: We will take testimony
14	from the public but first I'd like to ask the members
15	of the Committee if they have any statements.
16	MS. LIU: I have a statement, yes. The
17	Central Park Boathouse is a treasured space, not only
18	for the Manhattan community but everybody living and
19	visiting New York City. It's a beautiful building
20	that has created countless memories for its visitors.
21	This administration has worked
22	incredibly hard to ensure that new management was
23	selected to reopen and manage the Boathouse in time
24	for the summer season. So I'm incredibly excited for
25	Legends to reopen the Boathouse this summer, and very

1 appreciative of the Parks team that works tirelessly 2 to get stuff done. 3 MS. STODDART: Thank you. Would anyone 4 else like to testify? Yes, Borough of Manhattan. MS. VEST: Thank you. The Borough of 5 6 Manhattan is thrilled that the -- let me begin again. 7 The Manhattan Borough President is thrilled that the Loeb Boathouse, much like much of Manhattan, is 8 9 beginning to make a post-pandemic comeback. 10 We appreciate the efforts that the 11 Parks department, working closely with the 12 Conservancy, made to ensure that this iconic Central 13 Park amenity has a confident operator in place for 14 this busy summer season. We hope that the Parks department makes similar efforts to ensure that this 15 16 storied Manhattan establishment remains accessible to Central Park visitors of all income levels when 17 18 approving the final menu. 19 This new concession and the Loeb 20 Boathouse will achieve multiple goals set forth by the 21 Conservancy, by bringing in substantial revenue to the city, providing work for 200 New Yorkers, and 2.2 23 importantly, expanding nearby public restrooms. This 24 being the case, I look forward to voting in support of 25 this concession next week, on behalf of the Manhattan

1 Borough President. Thank you. 2 MS. STODDART: Thank you. Anyone else from the committee? 3 4 Will the Clerk please call the next person who wishes to testify? 5 6 THE CLERK: Tom Olivia. 7 MR. OLIVIA: Good afternoon. My name is Thomas Olivia, and I'm here on behalf of the Hotel 8 Trades Council. We represent almost 40,000 workers in 9 10 New York. I've been a representative from the Hotel 11 Trades Council for the workers of the Boathouse for 12 eight years now. 13 The Boathouse has been a longstanding 14 institution in New York City, and we're honored to be 15 here today to express our support for this project. 16 Since 2011, we've represented nearly 130 workers at 17 the Boathouse: servers, cooks, bartenders, and many 18 The members we represented had great jobs and others. 19 outstanding benefits that allowed them to take care of 20 their families and live in this city with dignity. 21 However, after it closed, the workers have lost their jobs, and struggled to find employment 2.2 that has created similar excellent healthcare 23 24 coverage. We were thrilled when Mayor Adams announced 25 the reopening of the Boathouse. Legends Hospitality

1 has agreed not just to rehire these workers, but to 2 also assume the existing union contract. 3 With the reopening of the Boathouse, 4 hundreds of our members can finally get back to work, and continue supporting themselves and their families. 5 6 We want to thank everyone here today for hearing our 7 testimony, and hope to see this project advance quickly. Thank you very much. 8 9 MS. STODDART: Thank you. Will the 10 Clerk please call the next person who wishes to 11 testify? 12 THE CLERK: We have now heard all 13 testimony on this calendar item. 14 MS. STODDART: Thank you. Will the 15 Clerk please call the next calendar item? 16 THE CLERK: New York City Department of Small Business Services, Calendar Item No. 2: In the 17 18 matter of the intent to award as a concession an 19 agreement with First Flight Heliports, LLC doing 20 business as Saker Aviation Services, to provide for 21 the operation of the Downtown Manhattan Heliport in the borough of Manhattan. 2.2 23 The license will provide for (1) five-24 year initial term, commencing upon written Notice to 25 Proceed, which may be renewed for (1) additional five-

1 year term, exercisable at the sole discretion of EDC 2 and SBS. Please be advised that this item will 3 4 be held over to a subsequent FCRC Public Hearing. 5 MS. STODDART: Thank you. Before we conclude, I want to ask if 6 7 any of the agencies presenting calendar items today have any statements for the record prior to the close 8 9 of the hearing? 10 MR. CERRON: Sure, just briefly. Parks is excited to select Legends as its new operator for 11 12 the iconic Loeb Boathouse. Legends specializes in 13 delivering world-class experiences for its patrons 14 throughout the city, country, and internationally. 15 They are strong, operating -- improvements to bring 16 the Boathouse back to its former glory. As a crucial 17 amenity for all of Central Park and its visitors, 18 we're looking forward to reopening this summer, and 19 also to ensuring that it's accessible and affordable for all visitors. 20 21 MS. STODDART: Thank you. If no one 2.2 else wishes to speak on Calendar Item No. 1, that 23 concludes today's hearing.
