14	The proposed franchise agreement
15	is requesting to extend the term of
16	the Agreement by five years and
17	incorporate additional rights and
18	responsibilities, including, without
19	limitation, an increase in the overall
20	number of bus shelters and automatic
21	public toilets that the company may
22	install maintain, and operate, and the
23	modification of certain revenue
24	requirements applicable to the
25	company.

2	CHAIRMAN HEINZEN: Excuse me.
3	There have been some changes to the
4	concession documents. These have been
5	distributed to the committee members,
6	and I will now ask DOT to read those
7	changes into the record.
8	MS. CRAVEN: Thank you, Chair
9	Heinzen. Hi, everybody, I'm Michelle
10	Craven. I'm the assistant
11	commissioner for Cityscape and
12	Franchises at New York City DOT.
13	After considering the comments
14	made at the public hearing and
15	testimony submitted, the City is
16	making the following changes to the
17	proposed amendment: In Section
18	2.5.3.3(a) the amendment makes five
19	references to 60 schedule-wide bus
20	shelters. The City is changing the
21	numbers 60 to the number 43 in all
22	five places to reflect the changes to
23	Schedule Y, which I'll explain
24	shortly. The rest of section
25	2.5.3.3(a) will remain the same.

1 The final sentence of Section 2 9.2.2 shall now read as follows: 3 In 4 addition for each such year of the term, the City shall receive A, 50 5 percent of annual gross revenues in 6 7 excess of \$105 million; B, 52.5 percent of annual gross revenues in 8 9 excess of \$150 million; and C, 55 10 percent of annual gross revenues in 11 excess of \$200 million. 12 The final sentence of section 9.2.3 shall now read as follows: 13 Τn 14 addition for each such year of the 15 term, the City shall receive 50 16 percent of annual gross revenues in excess of \$110 million; B, 52.5 17 18 percent of annual gross revenues in 19 excess of \$150 million; and C, 55 20 percent of annual gross revenues in excess of \$200 million. 21 In Schedule C, the City will 2.2 23 make the following changes: The cash 24 component for year 17, shall now be

\$64,401,000, the cash component for

25

1 2 year 18 shall now be \$63,834,000, the cash component for years 19 and 20 3 4 shall now be \$49,316,000. The cash component for years 21 through 25 5 shall now be \$34,316,000. The total 6 7 cash component for years one through 25 shall now be \$1,337,336,000. 8 Footnote 2 will now read as 9 10 follows: In addition, the City shall 11 receive, A, 50 percent of annual gross 12 revenues in excess of \$105 million; B, 13 52.5 percent of annual gross revenues 14 in excess of \$150 million; and C, 55 15 percent of annual gross revenues in excess of \$200 million. 16 Footnote 3 will now read as 17 18 follows: In addition, the City shall 19 receive 50 percent of annual gross 20 revenues in excess of \$110 million; B, 21 52.5 percent of annual gross revenues in excess of \$150 million; and C, 55 2.2 23 percent of the annual gross revenues in excess of \$200 million. 24 Finally, we're removing 17 25

While 19 JCDecaux should not have withheld their rent for public space over the 20 21 last two years, we appreciate their 2.2 willingness to negotiate with our 23 office to provide an additional 2 24 million base payment and additional 25 revenue sharing to the City as part of

1 2 today's deal. 3 Thank you. 4 CHAIRMAN HEINZEN: Thank you, Christian. 5 Any other member wish to make a 6 7 statement at this time? (No response.) 8 9 Hearing none, may I please have a 10 motion to move this item for a vote? Is 11 there a motion to move? 12 MS. 1 2 would anyone like to make a statement? 3 MR. STOVER: Hi, Bill. The 4 Comptroller's office would like to make a statement on this item as well. 5 CHAIRMAN HEINZEN: 6 Please. 7 MR. STOVER: Thank you. The non-essential helicopter trips from 8 9 the Downtown Manhattan Heliport may be 10 convenient for busy executive, leisure 11 travelers, and sightseers and reduce 12 the time it takes to get from Wall 13 Street to private jets at Teterboro, but the constant noise and carbon 14 15 admissions make many residents of 16 Manhattan and Brooklyn miserable, and 17 it generates very little revenue for 18 the City of New York. 19 Rather than continuing 20 operations, we should allow the City's contract with Downtown Manhattan 21 2.2 Heliport to expire and re-purpose the 23 space for a less noxious and more 24 sustainable use. 25 Thank you.

1 2 CHAIRMAN HEINZEN: Thank you. 3 Does any other member have a 4 comment that they would like to make for the record, or are there any 5 6 questions? 7 MS.
