HOPE 2023 was our first successful return to a volunteer-based HOPE, and we're excited to keep it going in 2024!

The annual NYC Youth Count is conducted to obtain information on the housing experiences of youth and young adults. Runaway and Homeless Youth staff in partnership with youth-serving programs including educational programs, community centers, workforce programs, drop-in centers, outreach teams, and other program volunteers, will ask young people between the ages of 14 and 24 to participate in a short anonymous survey. Preventing Older Adult Homelessness and Abuse

A recent report from The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' (HHS) Office of the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation gives an **overview of what is known about the older adult homeless population**, their needs, and available supportive services to address these needs. <u>Check out the report here!</u>

A 2011 study found that **76 out of 1,000 older New Yorkers experienced elder abuse** – for instance physical, verbal, neglect, financial, and sexual – during a one-year period. **Survivors of elder abuse often do not report it or face challenges with obtaining help.** Which may include cognitive diseases such as depression or dementia, fear of retaliation, shame, immigration concerns, cultural factors, and more. Learning more about elder abuse and how

we all can disrupt or prevent abuse, can help address the challenges older adults experience. **If you suspect an elderly person is the victim of abuse, please call 311.**
