# "Go Purple" for DV Awareness

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month. Domestic and intimate partner violence (DV) affects people of all races, cultures, religions, income levels, sexual orientations, and gender identities. In 2022, there were over 119,000 intimate partner incidents reported to the NYPD. Unfortunately, there are many intersectional concerns that may influence a survivors' choice to avoid seeking help from the police or DV service providers, which means the incidence of DV in our City is likely far greater than reported. NYC based Domestic Violence Services' residential and community-based programs work hard every day to provide prevention and intervention services, crisis counseling, advocacy and legal services to help families and individuals impacted by DV. Collectively these programs serve over 10,000 survivors and their family members annually - DSS operates the largest DV shelter network in the country.

This year, October 19th is "Go Purple Day." In solidarity with survivors, I encourage everyone to wear purple that day. Stay tuned for more information.
