- Introducing Resident Roundtable Members via NYCHA communication channels
- Facilitating introduction to Resident Leaders & CBOs
- Sharing publicly available development demographics and maps
- NYCHA cannot share Personally Identifiable Information (PII) without the express written consent of residents.



Roundtable Member Outreach Strategies:

- Identify Key Neighborhood Stakeholders
 - Resident Association Leaders
 - Key Influencers of the Neighborhood (unofficial leaders)
 - Local Community Based Organizations (Community & Senior Centers, Settlement Houses, etc.)
- Identify Key Opportunities to Share Information and Gather Feedback
 - Community events/meetings/communications (preexisting & Roundtable Member-established)



Stipend Requirements – Update

- Mandatory Meetings
 - Monthly Resident Roundtable
 - Monthly Subcommittee
- Internal Meeting(s)
 - Meetings that take place amongst the subcommittee members without NYCHA liaisons
- External Engagement
 - Outreach conducted within your Neighborhood Portfolio (i.e., door-to-door, surveying, e-mail, events, CBO's, etc.)
