17	so we will introduce DEP's request for cease and
18	desist orders. Russell Pecunies.
19	RUSSELL PECUNIES, ESQ., DEPARTMENT OF
20	ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION (DEP): Good morning.
21	Russell Pecunies with DEP Legal. This month, the
22	Department is asking the Board to approve, I
23	believe it's 29 requests for cease and desist
24	orders.

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In each of these cases, the property owner has been directed by a Commissioner's order to install backflow prevention devices at the property. After the owner's failure to do so, the owner has been issued a summons, which has been adjudicated in violation. And in each of these cases, the building owner still has not complied with the Commissioner's order to install.

Based on that, the Department is asking the Board to issue an order to cease and desist in each of these cases.

MS. RICHARD: Alright. Are there any questions? Alright. So is there a motion to approve? Alright, motion. All in favor? Okay, it's unanimous.

MR. PECUNIES: Okay. That's it for this month.

MS. RICHARD: Alright. Thank you.

Alright. And we have an objection for DEP's request for pre-sealing reports by Kelly Corso.

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OATH: Good morning. Kelly Corso, Assistant

Commissioner for Adjudications for the Hearings

Division. We have twenty-five pre-sealing

reports for the Board today. Twenty-one of those

reports involve backflow cases. In all of those

cases, the hearing officers have recommended that

there be no sealing or further action taken,

based on the evidence of compliance that the

respondents presented at the hearings.

The remaining four reports are for Noise Code cases. These cases involve air conditioning, kitchen exhaust and water/plumbing equipment. And, in all of those cases, the respondents presented evidence at the hearings of work that was taken to bring the cited equipment into compliance with the Noise Code.

Based on the respondents' evidence of compliance, the hearing officers agree with DEP's recommendation that the equipment remain unsealed, provided that DEP's initial reinspection and re-inspections for a period, period of 180 days show no violations.

And that's it.

MS. RICHARD: Alright. Are there any questions? Okay. Is there a motion to approve? All in favor? Alright, that's a unanimous vote. Okay, thank you.

Alright. Is there a motion to go in Executive Session to discuss new cases, judicial report and full Board appeals?

MS. KNAUER: Motion.

MS. RICHARD: Okay, there's a motion.

And all in favor? Okay. Thank you.

MS. RICHARD: Alright. So we're back in open session, having discussed the judicial report and three full Board appeals. And so we'd like to take now a vote so that we can close out the meeting.

Let's take a vote on DOB v. Owen Foster.

Alternative One: all those in favor of affirming the hearing officer decision, dismissing the two summonses, finding that respondent did not unlawfully advertise in violation of the Code.

All in favor of affirming the hearing officer

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dismissing, please raise your hands. Okay. We have a vote of four.

Alternative decision Two: all those in favor of reversing the hearing officer decision and finding that respondent violated the Code provision for unlawful advertisement, all those in favor? One, two, three, four, five. Okay. Any abstentions?

MS. GRAHAM: Abstain.

MS. RICHARD: There is one. Okay.

Alright, thank you. We have had a significant amount of discussions of the issue of our requirement to have seven voting members in favor of any particular proposal in order to act, and we will continue to try to resolve that issue so that we can resolve, you know, close decisions like this one. For now, I think the plan is to measure from a hu-, hundred eighty (180) days from the filing of this appeal and to, at that point, if we don't have a seven-vote decision, to then issue the hearing officer decision, send a notice to the parties that that decision will be the final one.
