1 August 17, 2023 2 under Code, Administrative Code 24-244(b) 3 matters. 4 OLGA STATZ, ESQ., DEPUTY COMMISSIONER/ 5 GENERAL COUNSEL, OATH: Thank you very much. 6 Good to see, I'm happy to see everyone. 7 We reviewed the Administrative Code and, 8 in our review, we observed that 24-257(a), as you 9 know, allows the Board to impose civil penalties 10 and to hear matters that are brought by DEP. 11 furthermore, in the Administrative Code, the 12 civil penalties are set out. 13 In addition to that, we also noticed 14 that according 24-257(b)(5), in addition to the 15 possibility of imposing a civil penalty, the 16 Board is also --17 RACHEL AMAR, SENIOR ADVISOR TO 18 COMMISSIONER, OATH: Just, let's put the 19 microphone [unintelligible] [00:01:57]. 20 MS. STATZ: Sure. The Board is also 21 empowered to remit that civil penalty in certain 2.2 instances, specifically where there's been a 23 finding at the hearing that the condition, the

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violating condition has been corrected.

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The Board has reviewed that law and has determined that it chooses to exercise this authority with respect to Noise Code violations that occur under section 24-244(b). And in order to effectuate that, that use of discretion, the Board is basically saying that whenever hearings, whenever, at a hearing, a determination is made that the condition was corrected, the Board will be remitting those penalties to zero. And that is, that is what the, that is what this was about.

Are there any questions?

MR. REHMAN: Thank you. Matthew?

MR. SCHNEID: Can you explain how this will work in practice, and what -- how we're going to tell the hearing officers about how they should be enforcing this particular rule?

MS. STATZ: Yes. One of the roles of the General Counsel's Office, my office, is, on a regular basis, we put out memoranda to the hearing officers, explaining changes in the law, updates in the law, changes in civil penalties, case law that's come out that can affect their

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determinations. So what we'll be doing is putting out a memorandum with this resolution amended and a short statement summarizing the resolution, saying, from now on, if there is a finding of correction of the violation, the Board has decided to exercise its discretion to remit the penalty.

MR. SCHNEID: Does that, or does that mean each case, if they find, have a finding, that they will not [unintelligible] [00:03:51]?

Or is that at the discretion of each?

MS. STATZ: No. Actually, the, the statute allows, it gives the Board the discretion. It doesn't give the hearing officers the discretion. So what the Board is doing is it's exercising its discretion by informing the hearing officers that this is the result that they want in those cases where correction has been found.

MR. REHMAN: Other questions or comments? Okay, thank you. I'd like to ask for a motion to vote on the resolution respecting the Environmental Control Board's exercise of its

Okay. 16 Seeing none, hearing none, I'd like to request a 17 motion to adjourn today's meeting. Okay, there's 18 a motion and a second. Thank you very much. We 19 have a second.
