this, for this board meeting, we have the usual batch of requests for cease and desist orders relating to backflow prevention devices. of these cases, the DEP Commissioner has determined that the premises in question requires the installation of backflow prevention devices, and an order has been issued to the property owner requiring the installation of such devices. After that order was not complied with in each of these cases, a summons was issued to the property owner for failing to install, which has been adjudicated in violation. And the, in each of these cases, there is a continuing failure to install the required devices. So for each of these, DEP is asking that the Board issue an order to cease and desist.

MR. PECUNIES: Okay. I also have one request for a cease and desist order from the Bureau of Wastewater Treatment. This pertains to New Grain Earth Food Corp. at 380 East 205th Street in the Bronx. The situation here is that DEP inspected the cited premises and issued a Commissioner's order in March requiring the respondent to install a number of different pieces of equipment related to grease interceptor capabilities, so they were directed to install, basically, grease traps on the floor drains and two different sinks. They did not comply with that order and were subsequently issued a series of summonses in, during most of 2019. They had a mandatory compliance meeting scheduled for November 13th, which they failed to appear for. The summonses have been adjudicated in violation. They failed to appear on three of them. As of today, they are still out of compliance with the order and are still in violation of the sewer And based on that, DEP is asking the Board code. to issue an order to cease and desist.
