4	MR. FIDEL F. DEL VALLE, ESQ.,
5	CHAIRPERSON, COMMISSIONER & CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE
6	LAW JUDGE, OATH: Good morning everyone.
7	ALL: Good morning.
8	MR. DEL VALLE: I don't know how smart
9	it was to have this meeting three days before
10	Christmas and Hanukkah. But be that as it may, is
11	there a motion to accept the minutes of the last
12	meeting? It's unanimous with the abstention of
13	the Health Department. And Hari.
14	MR. DEL VALLE: I'm going to ask Simone
15	Salloum to introduce a proposed rulemaking
16	regarding repeal of the Department of Buildings
17	penalty schedule from one set of rules in
18	anticipation of the Buildings Department adopting
19	its penalty schedules within their rules.
20	MS. SIMONE SALLOUM: I'm Simone Salloum,
21	Assistant General Counsel. And there's not much
22	to say about it. We're proposing the repeal of
23	the Buildings penalty schedule, which is found in
24	Section 3-103 of Subchapter G of Title 48 of the

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Rules of the City of New York. It contains
penalties for violations issued by the Department
of Buildings for violations of Title 1, 27 and
28; one of RCNY 27 and 28 of the Administrative
Code.

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7 DOB is proposing their own penalty schedule in their own rules and we're 8 9 coordinating to make sure that there's no lag in 10 that, so the rules will be repealed at the same 11 time that the new penalty schedule goes into 12 effect. This is part of the retrospective rule 13 review that we're working with the Mayor's Office 14 on to repeal the legacy penalty schedules out of 15 our rules and have new penalty schedules promulgated by the enforcement agencies. So if 16 17 anyone has any questions? Yes.

18 MR. ERNEST CAVALLO: Ernest Cavallo, 19 Citizen Member. I continue to oppose this 20 wholesale repeal of the rules that this Board 21 voted on and having the agencies themselves 2.2 promulgate their own rules without a layer of 23 scrutiny that having citizen members review the 24 various proposals. It's less transparency. It's

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2	not more. It's a bad government initiative. It
3	will remain a bad government initiative. It fixes
4	a problem that does not exist. An extra month in
5	putting a rule schedule into effect is not
6	justification for this wholesale change in the
7	way we have done business for years. That's all I
8	have to say.
9	MR. DEL VALLE: Any other questions? Is
10	there a motion?
11	MS. SHAMONDA GRAHAM: Should I abstain?
12	MR. DEL VALLE: You don't have to but
13	you can.
14	MR. DEL VALLE: There's a motion. Is
15	there a vote?
16	MS. GRAHAM: I'll abstain.
17	MR. DEL VALLE: Okay. One, two, three,
18	four, five, six.
19	MR. CAVALLO: Opposed.
20	MR. DEL VALLE: One opposed. Any
21	abstentions?
22	MS. GRAHAM: One.
23	MR. DEL VALLE: And one abstention
24	and three abstentions. Thank you. Simone?

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2	MS. SALLOUM: Okay. The next proposal
3	that we have for your consideration is the repeal
4	of the Noise Code penalty schedule. This schedule
5	is found in Section 3-115 of Subchapter G of
6	Chapter 3 of Title 48 in the Rules of the City of
7	New York and contains penalties for notices of
8	violation issued by DEP for violations of Title
9	15 of the RCNY, Title 10 and 24 of the
10	Administrative Code. And similarly DEP is
11	proposing a companion rule adding the Noise Code
12	penalty schedule to Title 15 of the RCNY.
13	Again, this is part of the retrospective
14	rule review but it's also part of the Criminal
15	Justice Reform Act. The local law was passed that
16	changes the penalty amounts for some of the noise
17	code violations and so that goes into effect in
18	March, which is why we're bringing the repeal to
19	you now, so that DEP can get their new Noise Code
20	penalty schedule in effect by that date. Any
21	questions?
22	MR. CAVALLO: Ernest Cavallo, Citizen
23	Member. I oppose it for the same reasons I
24	opposed the previous proposal.

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2	MR. DEL VALLE: Any other questions? Is
3	there a motion? All those in favor? One, two,
4	three, four, five, six, seven in favor. All
5	opposed? One opposed. Abstentions? Two
6	abstentions. Thank you.
7	MS. SALLOUM: Thank you.
8	MR. DEL VALLE: DEP has a request for
9	cease and desist orders. Russell please.
10	MR. RUSSELL PECUNIES: Good morning. I'm
11	Russell Pecunies with DEP's Bureau of Legal
12	Affairs. This morning DEP is asking the Board to
13	approve a cease and desist order under the Sewer
14	Code. The respondent is Brunch NY Inc. at 161
15	Division Avenue in Brooklyn. This is a
16	nonresidential establishment where food is
17	prepared. An inspection determined that the
18	respondent needed to install a variety of grease
19	interceptors on various sinks and drains.
20	Subsequent inspections determined that on
21	existing grease interceptors, they were severely
22	overloaded.
23	After a series of inspections showed
24	that respondent had still not complied with

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2	Commissioner's Orders to come into compliance
3	with the code, the Bureau of Wastewater Treatment
4	determined that a request for a cease and desist
5	order would be appropriate and that respondent
6	should be required to appear and establish that
7	they have installed and are properly maintaining
8	appropriately-sized grease interceptors at this
9	location. So based on that, DEP is asking the
10	Board to approve an order to cease and desist.
11	MR. DEL VALLE: Any questions? Motion? I
12	think it's unanimous with one abstention?
13	MR. PECUNIES: Yup. DEP also has four
14	requests for cease and desist orders this month
15	under the Noise Code. The first is Hillview

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16 Specialty Foods at 2787 Broadway in Manhattan. 17 This location has been cited on five occasions, 18 one last year and four this year for noise from 19 the kitchen exhaust. Based on the continuing 20 violations and continuing failure to come into 21 compliance, DEP is asking the Board to issue an order to cease and desist. 22

23 MR. DEL VALLE: Questions? Motion? 24 Again, it's unanimous with one abstention.

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2	MR. PECUNIES: Okay. The next one under
3	the Noise Code is 515 Madison Group, located at
4	515 Madison Avenue. This location has been cited
5	on three occasions this year since March for
6	noise from the kitchen exhaust. Due to the
7	continuing violations and continuing failure to
8	comply, DEP is asking the Board to issue an order
9	to cease and desist.
10	MR. DEL VALLE: Questions? Motion? And
11	again it's unanimous with one abstention.
12	MR. PECUNIES: Okay. The third one is
13	Birds & Bubbles LLC at 100B Forsyth Street in
14	Manhattan. This is a restaurant. There have been
15	five violations cited, three last year and two
16	this year for noise from the kitchen exhaust. Due
17	to the continuing violations and failure to come
18	into compliance, DEP is asking the Board to issue
19	an order to cease and desist.
20	MR. DEL VALLE: Questions? Motion? It's
21	unanimous with one abstention.
22	MR. PECUNIES: And finally, we have one
23	that's not a kitchen exhaust. This is Bedford
24	Auto Repair LLC, located at 1232 Bedford Avenue

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2	in Brooklyn. This location has been cited on
3	three occasions since May of this year from noise
4	for the generator. We do understand that the
5	landlord is attempting to evict this tenant.
6	However, since that has not happened yet, because
7	of the repeated violations and continuing failure
8	to comply, DEP is asking the Board to issue an
9	order to cease and desist.
10	MR. DEL VALLE: Questions? Motion? It's
11	unanimous with one abstention.
12	MR. PECUNIES: Okay. And finally we have
13	the 28 requests for cease and desist orders
14	relating to failure to install backflow
15	prevention devices. In each of these cases, the
16	building owner has been ordered to install
17	appropriate backflow prevention devices. They
18	have failed to comply. They've been issued a
19	summons, which has been adjudicated in violation.
20	They're still not in compliance. Based on that,
21	DEP is asking the Board to issue an order to
22	cease and desist in each of these cases.
23	And I would just note that there was
24	actually this past week a real life case of a

	backflow incident in Corpus Christi, Texas. A
3	chemical was introduced due to a faulty backflow
4	prevention device from a company that makes
5	asphalt. And the tap water was off limits in
6	Corpus Christi for two days because of that
7	incident. So, every once in a blue moon there is
8	an actual event which occurs and it does
9	illustrate why we do enforce this. And so
10	although it's rare, it does happen.
11	MR. DEL VALLE: Questions? Motion?
12	Unanimous with one abstention.
13	MR. PECUNIES: Thank you.
14	MR. DEL VALLE: Pre-sealing orders?
15	MS. KELLY CORSO: Good morning. I'm
16	Kelly Corso, Assistant Director for Adjudications
17	for OATH Hearings Division. And this morning we
18	have 22 pre-sealing reports; 18 of these involve
19	backflow violations and one involves an Air Code
20	violation and one involves a Noise Code violation
21	and two involve Sewer Code violations.
22	Eighteen of the pre-sealing reports
23	involve backflow violations and in all of these
24	cases, the hearing officers recommend no sealing

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or other action based on respondents' evidence of compliance that was presented at the hearings. For the Air Code case, the respondent did not appear for the pre-sealing hearing. However, DEP recommended that the C&D order be discontinued because DEP had a recent inspection of the premises, showing that the cited equipment had been removed. So, the hearing officer in that case agrees with DEP's recommendation that the C&D order be discontinued.

12 In the noise case, the respondent's 13 representative came to the pre-sealing hearing 14 and presented evidence of work done on the 15 elevator door. This was a parking garage, which 16 had an elevator door which was -- the elevator 17 door unit which was causing the noise. They 18 showed that the equipment had come into 19 compliance at the hearing. And the hearing 20 officer is recommending that DEP re-inspect the 21 equipment forthwith and that the equipment remain 2.2 unsealed if that initial re-inspection and 23 further re-inspections for a period of 180 days 24 show no violation.

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2	And finally, in the two Sewer Code
3	cases, the respondents did not appear for the
4	pre-sealing hearings. But DEP has recommended
5	that the C&D orders be discontinued because the
6	respondents have come into compliance with the
7	Sewer Code. And the hearing officers in both
8	cases agree with DEP's recommendation and
9	recommend that the C&D orders be discontinued in
10	both cases. And that's it.
11	MR. DEL VALLE: Questions? Motion?
12	Unanimous. Is there a motion to go into Executive
13	Session for the judicial report? Unanimous.

16	MR. DEL VALLE: Thank you. I just want
17	to bring up one thing before we adjourn. The next
18	meeting had been scheduled for January 27 but it
19	turns out there is a major time conflict on that
20	date. We are going to see if we can hold folks to
21	reschedule it either later in the day or the
22	following Monday, the 30 th , and we'll reach out to
23	you guys and sort it out. And we'll figure it out
24	and we'll let everybody know. Thank you. We're

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2	adjourned. I assume everyone is in concurrence
3	that we are adjourned. And happy holidays and see
4	you next year.
