#### **November 2021 community board submissions**


Below are early observations from community board (CB) submissions for Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 Statements of Community District Needs.

- 'Affordable housing' remains the most frequently-identified pressing issue, named by nearly half of all Community Boards
  - 'Parks and Open Space' (15 CBs), 'Land Use Trends' (14), and 'Traffic' (14) were next most common selections
- The number of CBs identifying 'Schools' as a most pressing issue has decreased to 13 this year from 20 in 2019
  - 'Infrastructure resiliency' increased to 12 CBs, from 9 in 2020
  - 11 of 59 CBs selected 'Crime and public safety', triple the number in 2019
- In the Public Safety and Emergency Services policy area, 'Crime prevention programs' became the most frequently identified issue
- In the Parks, Cultural, and other Community Facilities policy area, 'Park care and maintenance' remains the most frequently identified issue






