

Transit-oriented Development

City of Yes for Housing Opportunity is a plan to tackle our housing shortage by making it possible to build a little more housing in every neighborhood. Together, we can make our city more affordable without dramatic changes in any one community.

An important part of this plan is **re-legalizing modest apartment buildings near public transit**.

How it works:

Adding housing near public transit is a **commonsense approach** to support convenient lifestyles, limit the need for car ownership, lower congestion, and reduce carbon emissions.

Many modest apartment buildings already exist in lower-density areas of the five boroughs, most of them built between the 1920s and 1950s. However, current zoning bans new ones despite the housing shortage and climate change.


City of Yes would allow **modest 3-5 story apartment buildings like these where they fit best**: large lots on wide streets or corners within a half mile of public transit.



What comes next:

City of Yes for Housing Opportunity is now in public review, and receiving input from community boards and borough presidents. It will then go to the City Planning Commission for a vote. If passed, it is anticipated to come for a vote before the City Council by the end of 2024.
