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MR. DO: Good morning, everyone.

I'm calling this meeting to order at

10:04. I am David Do, the

Commissioner and Chair of the Taxi and

Limousine Commission. I'm here,

joined by Commissioners Mitchell,

Sorrentino, Jiha and Velazquez. I

want to thank you all for being here

today and, of course, supporting the

work of the Commission. Thank you.

I also want to thank our team for putting together this hearing today, especially on this meeting to vote because we have Commissioner Aguado here virtually. So thank you also, Commissioner Aguado, for being here. I know that it was a little bit difficult to do all this, but we made it work and I am so happy to be here today.

First, I want to announce successes of the Taxi and Limousine Commission on the MRP Plus Program.

We have now reached \$350 million in

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debt relief. This is a historic effort by the TLC and our partners; and so I'm very excited by that. But if you have not yet signed up to the Owner/Driver Resource Center, I encourage you to sign up soon because the deadline to apply is on January 31st. E-mail driversupport@tlc.nyc.gov or by calling (718)391-5511. So again, you only have one week left to enroll.

I also want to advise everyone in the community about the February 1st minimum high volume for-hire driver pay increases. That will be increased according to the 2022 annual average increase on the consumer price index for urban wage earners. We have notified Uber and Lyft and sent out industry notice and those rates are posted on our website.

The increase should not be confused with the minimum pay increase based on rising operating costs that we have recently been fighting in

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court. We are still pursuing all of our options in that case and we'll be letting the community know our next steps in the near future.

Now, on to today's votes. Today we're voting on a set of rules that we've heard over two public hearings and we have received comments on. And your comments have really advised us on some of the changes that will be reflected today.

First, the Medallion Relief
Program Rules will be included with
language that qualifying loans can be
restructured at less than 25 years, so
long as they're for 10 years, and that
the monthly payments are no more than
\$1,235.

For the Rules Clean-Up Package, we further clarify the lease cancellation language, and made it clear that TSP and E-Hail providers are responsible for collecting and forwarding on both the TIF, the Taxi Improvement Fund, and the SHLIF

1	payments directly to the TLC.
2	We are also voting on vehicle
3	specifications to allow for the use of
4	battery electric vehicles and finally,
5	we will be voting on the rules to
6	release 1,000 battery electric
7	vehicles for the for-hire vehicle
8	industry.
9	So with that, I'll turn it over
10	to our general counsel, Sherryl Eluto.
11	Thank you, Sherryl.
12	MS. ELUTO: Commissioners, the
13	first item before you are the minutes
14	of the November 15, 2022 Commission
15	Meeting. I will now call a vote to
16	adopt the minutes.
17	All in favor of adopting minutes
18	from November 15th, please raise your
19	hands.
20	(Commissioners raised their
21	hands.)
22	Commissioner Aguado raised his
23	hand, so the minutes are adopted
24	unanimously.
25	I will now call on Director of

1	Base and Business Services, Fabian
2	Cancel, to present the base license
3	applications.
4	MR. CANCEL: Good morning,
5	Commissioner and attendees. My name
6	is Fabian Cancel. I'm the director of
7	the TLC Base and Business Unit.
8	Eleven bases have been submitted for
9	your review and we will await your
10	approval and your determination.
11	MS. ELUTO: Commissioners, can
12	we have a vote to adopt the base
13	license recommendations?
14	(Commissioners raised their
15	hands.)
16	Unanimous and Commissioner
17	Aguado, yes. The vote is in favor
18	unanimously. Thank you.
19	MR. CANCEL: Thank you very
20	much.
21	MS. ELUTO: Commissioners, we
22	will now turn to Item 5 of the agenda,
23	the Amendment to Medallion Relief
24	Rules. This rule is published in the
25	City record on December 9, 2022, for

1	public comment. A public hearing was						
2	held virtually by the TLC on						
3	January 11th. On January 20th, the						
4	final version of the proposed rule was						
5	post on our website, circulated to						
6	Commissioners, along with the hearing						
7	transcript and all written comments						
8	that were received.						
9	Commissioners, may we move for a						
10	vote? All in favor of adopting the						
11	rule, please raise your hand.						
12	(Commissioners raised their						
13	hands.)						
14	Commissioner Aguado? All right,						
15	yes. So the rule's adopted						
16	unanimously.						
17	We're also going to vote on the						
18	need for immediate implementation of						
19	the rule that we've just adopted, this						
20	way we can process the applications						
21	for the MRP program sooner.						
22	So all those in favor of						
23	adopting the motion, please raise your						
24	hand.						
25	(Commissioners raised their						

1	hands.)
2	Commissioner Aguado, thank you.
3	The motion's adopted unanimously.
4	We now turn to Item 6 on the
5	agenda, the changes to the Taxi Cab
6	Vehicle Specifications to allow for
7	electric vehicles. Again, the rule
8	was published in the City record on
9	November 18th. A public hearing was
10	held virtually by the TLC on
11	December 21st. On January 20th, the
12	final version of proposed rule was
13	posted on our website, circulated to
14	the Commissioners.
15	Commissioners, may we move for a
16	vote. All those in favor, please
17	raise your hand.
18	(Commissioners raised their
19	hands.)
20	Commissioner Aguado, thank you.
21	The vote is adopted unanimously the
22	rule's adopted unanimously.
23	Commissioners, we'll now turn to
24	Item 7 on the agenda, the FHV Electric
25	Vehicle Restricted License Rules. The

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rule was published in the City record on December 12th for public comment.

A public hearing was held virtually by the TLC on January 11th. On January 20th, a final version of proposed rules were posted on the website, circulated to the Commissioners.

After that was posted, we decided to make a change.

The rule provides that 600 licenses will be reserved for drivers to own one license, and then the 400 licenses will be for anyone, individual or corporation, and applicants can apply for multiple licenses.

I'm asking, at this time, that the Commissioners consider an updated version of the rule proposal that was circulated yesterday. In response to public comments received, we would like to have the rule provide for a limit on 400 EVFHV licenses, that at this time you can apply for a maximum of 25 licenses per social security or

1	EIN number. After the application
2	process is underway, if there are
3	still available licenses, the Chair
4	may announce additional availability.
5	We can adopt this version of the
6	rule in accordance to the City
7	Administrative Procedure Act, so long
8	as the Commission vote is unanimous.
9	Commissioners, do we have a
10	vote?
11	(Commissioners raised their
12	hands.)
13	And Commissioner Aguado, yes.
14	Great. The rule's adopted
15	unanimously.
16	And we have one more item, Item
17	8, the Regulatory Review Package.
18	This rule is published in the City
19	record on November 18th for public
20	comment. A public hearing was held
21	virtually on December 21st. On
22	January 20th, the final version of
23	proposed rule are posted on our
24	website and circulated to the
25	Commissioners.

1	Commissioners, may we move for a
2	vote on the rule?
3	(Commissioners raised their
4	hands.)
5	Commissioner Aguado?
6	Commissioner Aguado says, yes.
7	The rule's adopted unanimously,
8	great.
9	Now, I turn back to the Chair.
10	MR. DO: Great. Thank you all
11	for being here today. That moves
12	towards our conclusion of this meeting
13	today, but I want to remind drivers,
14	right, do not buy an electric vehicle
15	yet. New and more information will be
16	coming out in the next few weeks.
17	Specifically for the 600 licenses for
18	drivers, a Statement of Interest will
19	be available online around mid-March.
20	Shortly after, all others can apply
21	for the 400 licenses through a
22	Statement of Interest form online.
23	Again, we continue to advise people to
24	wait to know about the process before
25	purchasing an EV.

1	We appreciate everyone's
2	patience on this and we're committing
3	to issuing a very transparent process
4	and fair process for our community.
5	Again, I want to thank our
6	Commissioners for being here today and
7	that will conclude our meeting today
8	at 10:13.
