MR. JIHA: Good morning. Welcome to the Taxi and Limousine Commission. Let the record reflect that we have a quorum for the meeting.

NYC - Taxi & Limousine Commission Meeting

Today, the Commission will vote on a rules package to repeal the requirement that certain taxi owners must purchase the Taxi of Tomorrow. And then a vote on a rules package to implement the accommodations from the TLC investigation of taxi brokers, which occurred in 2019.

Bill, would you like to add anything?

MR. HEINZEN: Good morning. Thank you.

I did want to mention that the Chief Chaplain Archbishop Hartman for TLC's Enforcement has had some health issues lately. And I just wanted to say to him, and to his family, that we are all keeping you in our thoughts and we wish you the best. So, I just ask that people do keep him in their thoughts.

As Commissioner Jiha mentioned, today the TLC will vote on a package of rules that flow from the broker investigation that Mayor

de Blasio ordered this summer and that TLC worked on, along with our partners at Department of Finance and Department of Worker and Consumer Protection. We think that these broker and agent rules will greatly increase the amount of transparency in the process and information. information that's available not only to potential medallion purchasers, but also information that's available to TLC and that will help us to audit and evaluate the health of the industry. Our new business practices accountability unit will play a key role, both in collecting and analyzing this information, doing periodic audits of the industry and also feeding that information into TLC leadership so that that information is fully incorporated into our decision-making process.

These rules, as we have said, are just one part of a larger effort. And this effort that we have taken to try to help and to stabilize the medallion industry stretches back over a few years after the first major

disruptions done by the apps. As you know, for many years TLC lacked the power to mimic the number of for-hire vehicle licenses and we have had that power since 2018. And we have seen that the overall number of licensed drivers and vehicles, both of which had hit record highs, have begun to decline. And this, combined with the increased responsibilities that we have put on the apps to provide trip and fare getting into the City to pay their drivers fairly and to provide accessible service that made it important to bring more stability, more predictability.

There's still a lot more to be done for the medallion industry and for all the sectors that we regulate. But we're lucky -- I just want to point out to say, the City is lucky and the industry is lucky. We have very intelligent and engaged commissioners. I can never say enough that those of us who don't work for the City, they do not get paid; they do this on a volunteer basis. And these commissioners, some of them are

selected by the mayor directly, some of them are appointed on the recommendation of the different council, pro-delegations. But all of them come together and they all -- we have seen them over and over come together, and they make decisions based on what's the best interest of the City, mostly the best interest of the drivers and passengers. So, I just want to thank them. We're also lucky that Commissioner Jiha agreed to serve as acting chair despite having at least one other day job. So, we appreciate that very much.

Also I just want to thank the drivers of the small businesses who we regulate and who have come to these hearings, never failing to tell us what's on their mind and to help improve our decision-making process. And finally, just thanks to the great team at TLC, who, during a period of transition that's stretched out a little longer than we thought it would, have done -- you more than kept things going. I think, in terms of sustainability and resiliency, you've

The next item on the agenda is the revision for the Taxicab Broker and Agent rules, which established the investigation into Taxi Brokers that occurred in mid-2019, as Acting Commission Heinzen described.

These rules were published in the City Record on September 30, 2019, with a comment deadline of October 30, 2019. A public hearing was held on these rules on October 30, 2019. A number of written comments were received, all of which were provided to the commissioners following the public hearing based on feedback from the public and stakeholders.

The staff recommended the following changes be made to the rules, as originally proposed. Brokers are required to disclose employees at the time of application. The revisions will require that brokers cannot collect a fee in respect of a transfer in which they have an interest, unless they have made proper disclosures to buyer and seller.

The changes were made to clarify that brokers may have separate contracts for buyers and sellers, but all that's included in the requirement disclosures. To clarify, the brokers has a duty to disclose known liens and encumbrances from wheelchair accessible vehicle hack-up requirements to purchasers. Permitted exceptions to the requirement for prompt payment funds due to broker's client when funds are being held under an escrow created for a particular purpose is culminated on clients responsibility for an

And finally, the revisions would extend the period by which an agent must give notice to an order of a change and the lease payment would be sixty days before the change. As required by CAPA, the final rules was posted to the Commission's website and provided to the commissioners on January 30, 2020.
