CHAIR DO: Good morning, everyone. My name is David Do, Commissioner and the Chair of the Taxi and Limousine Commission. The time is now 10:03, and I'm calling this meeting to order.

I'm joined today by our three new board of commissioners; Commissioner Bader,
Commissioner Chan, and Commissioner Kaufman,
welcome to our board. I also want to thank
Commissioner Sorrentino for his continued
service and his reappointment. And, of
course, we have Commissioner Velazquez here
as well.

Before we get into today's agenda items, I'd like to remind everyone that a week from today, on September 20th, we will be hearing public comments on our proposed Green Rides rules, which will require our high-volume fleet to be zero-emissions or wheelchair accessible by 2030.

The initiative represents the meaningful commitment to sustainability and accessibility by New York City. TLC's fleet is responsible for an estimated 600,000 metric tons of carbon emissions each year,

the majority of it coming from our rideshare vehicles. And Green Rides has saved drivers about 40 percent in fuel and maintenance cost. Uber and Lyft have already committed to their own, and this would formalize a measured and gradual approach. And I emphasize "gradual" because we're talking about small steps over a six-year period.

We saw tremendous interest in EVs back in March. The market is evolving rapidly, and we would like to hear your comments and ideas. So, please join us on Wednesday to make yourself heard.

I'm also excited to announce that we have completed our Flex Fare pilot evaluation report, which has been sent to our commissioners and will be posted on our website.

The Flex Fare pilot allow licensed taxi E-Hail apps to charge upfront fees, fares, to passengers, allowing taxi passengers to get the same kind of price enjoyed by FHV passengers. We are busy putting together the rules consistent with the report's conclusions, and look forward to presenting

on the report and the rules at our future hearing.

Today, we're voting on two rule proposals. The first rule proposal would allow for a broader range of cameras in taxis, SHLs, and all for-hire vehicles. And the rules would remove the requirement for partitions and cameras in livery vehicles.

The second rule proposal establishes a short-term for-hire vehicle storage program. FHV licenses could be placed in storage once during the two-year licensed period. We had originally proposed a 60-day period, but after listening to public testimony, we extended this to 90 days, in the final version.

Now, before I begin, I would like to turn it over to any of our commissioners for any comments this morning, especially our new commissioners.

Commissioner Bader, this is your first in-person meeting. Do you want to say a few words?

COMMISSIONER BADER: Good morning,
Mr. Chair, fellow commissioners. It's a

pleasure to be selected to serve as a member of this Commission. The responsibilities that we have affect millions of people who both work in the industry and who are served by the industry, and I look forward to working with fellow commissioners, the staff, and interested parties throughout the City, to ensure the protection and the best service we can provide to our taxi riding public and the hundreds of thousands of people who are employed in the industry.
