#### Taxi and Limousine Commission Meeting September 15, 2016

1	Proceedings
2	CHAIR JOSHI: Good morning. The time
3	now is 10:25, and we should have a quick
4	meeting today. We only have one vote on
5	our rules to approve a Universal License
6	Structure and our Penalty Review Package,
7	where we adjusted several of the penalties
8	for drivers.
9	A few remarks before we get started.
10	Just a moment of silence in recognition of
11	September 11th, which fell on Sunday. I
12	know that it was a day tragic day for
13	everyone, and as the years go by we tend
14	to forget sometimes, but it's important to
15	acknowledge it publicly and during our
16	work life.
17	(Moment of silence was held.)
18	CHAIR JOSHI: And on another sad
19	note, we lost a colleague, Lanel Sullivan
20	(phonetic), last month, who died suddenly.
21	She joined the TLC almost a year ago, and
22	quickly moved up to a promotion that
23	she recently received as supervisor of
24	case examiner; she worked for 311
25	previously. She's going to be very much

2	missed by her supervisors and her
3	colleagues, and I think the swiftness with
4	which she got ill and passed was a jolt
5	for all of us. But our sympathy and
6	condolences are with her and her family.
7	Yesterday we had our third honor roll
8	with more drivers than the prior two
9	years, almost 380 drivers. We had Council
10	members Vanessa Gibson, and Ydanis
11	Rodriguez, and Daniel Dromm all attended,
12	as well as our Vision Zero partners, Chief
13	Chan, Emily Gallo from DOT, and Kavita
14	Sanchez from MOIA. And all of them
15	participated and gave some really great
16	comments that I think the drivers
17	appreciated, it's all on Livestream if you
18	want to see it.
19	Here's a few numbers that I think are
20	good to know: 378 drivers in total; 188
21	drive just yellow; 46 drive just green; 88
22	drive just FHV; 2 drive yellow, green, and
23	FHV; 5 drive yellow and FHV; 5 drive
24	yellow and green; 30 drive green and FHV;
25	14 drive commuter vans; 15 were on the

2	honor roll three years in a row; 11 were
3	on the honor roll two years in a row
4	I'm sorry, 29 were on the honor roll two
5	years in a roll. So in total we had 44
6	honorees.
7	We also honored 28 accessible
8	drivers. They conducted about 14 trips a
9	week in 2016, and had no major violations
10	or crashes in the past year. And on
11	accessible dispatch, we've actually
12	reached our highest level ever, in August,
13	of 5,528 trips, which gives us a total of
14	40,000 trips completed year-to-date. Also
15	from January to the end of July, 20 of our
16	accessible drivers that were awarded
17	conducted 3,264 accessible trips.
18	Some of our other noteworthy
19	participants were our drivers that spoke.
20	We had Mr. Elliot Clugman and his
21	father I'm sorry, Mr. Howard Kugelman
22	and his father, Elliot. Both drove over
23	30 years, and they received a the lifetime
24	achievement award, as well as Howard being
25	called our singly for his safety record

2	and dedication to the industry, and now
3	his tip that we should all keep chocolate
4	on hand if we're feeling drowsy.
5	Joe Lerner was a base owner who came
6	and spoke as well. He owns Cautious Cars,
7	he named it well before our ceremony.
8	Nonetheless, it was the safest base in the
9	industry, and he also gave some tips on
10	what he advises his drivers to keep that
11	record.
12	We also had Ajit Bharth, who was
13	featured in the Wall Street Journal. He
14	was picked up literally in his cab to star
15	in Mens Fashion Week, and he's also an
16	honoree, so I got to take my picture with
17	the model.
18	And then a personal coincidence, that
19	I think was symbolic of our industry, one
20	of the awardees was also a driver who had,
21	over the weekend, returned keys to my
22	sister. So when he came up at the end I
23	did recognized him. He didn't believe I
24	was Commissioner then, yesterday he did.
25	We also had our IDNYC pop-up shops at

2	Staten Island, which is closed. They had
3	over 300 IDs issued, and we have one in
4	Falchi Building, which I think will close
5	tomorrow. But we'll continue to host
6	those events so that drivers can take
7	advantage of all the benefits a municipal
8	ID provides.
9	And today's hearing is really
10	about well, it's not a hearing, it's a
11	vote on the Universal License. I think we
12	have a picture of it. No? Some things
13	fell off, our Chief of Staff is having a
14	baby. So all right, we'll send that
15	around or we'll provide pictures later.
16	But that's the rule package oh,
17	the adoption of the minutes. All in favor
18	of adopting the minutes?
19	(Chorus of ayes.)
20	CHAIR JOSHI: And Base Applications.
21	MS. RICHARD: Good morning,
22	Commissioners. My name is Iesha Richard,
23	Assistant Commissioner of the Licensing
24	and Standards Division. Today I'm
25	presenting a total of 36 base applications

7 1 Proceedings 2 for your approval; 2 new base applications and 34 renewal applications, 10 of which 3 have change of ownership and officers. 4 5 Thank you. 6 CHAIR JOSHI: Do we accept the 7 recommendation? (Silent indication by all.) 8 CHAIR JOSHI: And with that, we'll 9 move on to the vote for the Universal 10 11 Licensing and Penalty Rules. MR. WILSON: So as the Commissioner 12 said, on the agenda this morning are rules 13 unifying the taxi and for-hire vehicle 14 15 licenses, as well as the penalty review revisions. These rules were published in 16 17 the City Record on June 17, 2016 with a comment deadline of July 17, 2016. A 18 19 public hearing was held on these rules July 18, 2016. 20 Following the public hearing, and 21 based on the Staff comment and 22 23 recommendation, based on the comments and 24 feedback we received from the public, we 25 made a number of changes to the rules.

2	Most notably, the definition of collision
3	was revised specifically to include
4	traffic incidents as defined in New York
5	State Law. The proposed penalties for
6	failing to inform a passenger when
7	out-of-town fare will be calculated, as
8	well as for refusing E-payment were
9	reduced.
10	The proposed rules were now
11	provide that for a new license applicant
12	there will be a single 15-month lookback
13	for critical driver penalty review. The
14	proposed rules clarify that FHV licensees
15	who held conditional licenses requiring
16	them to complete the education requirement
17	within a certain time period will continue
18	to be conditional licenses. Therefore,
19	the education requirement continues upon
20	the conversion of all the licenses
21	instituted in the new Universal License
22	Rules.
23	And finally the proposed rules, the
24	Sexual Harassment and Sexual Contact Rule,
25	as well as the Driver Fatigue Rule, which

2	will take effect no earlier than	
3	November 1st, the proposed rules were	
4	proposed before those rules were passed.	
5	So they're back in.	
6	So those were the significant	
7	changes. As Local Law requires, the final	
8	rule for Commissioner action was posted on	
9	the TLC website on September 12th, and	
10	sent to the Commissioners on that date.	
11	Are people ready to vote?	
12	CHAIR JOSHI: All in favor?	
13	(Chorus of ayes.)	
14	MR. WILSON: It passes unanimously.	
15	CHAIR JOSHI: That ends our	
16	record-fast meeting, ten minutes, at	
17	10:35. Thank you.
